

BATTLE OF THE SEXES

Starring Emma Stone and Steve Carell

In the wake of the sexual revolution and the rise of the women's movement, the 1973 tennis match between women's World #1 Billie Jean King (**Emma Stone**) and ex-men's-champ and hustler Bobby Riggs (**Steve Carell**) was billed as the *Battle of the Sexes* and was one of the most watched televised sports events of all time. The fiercely private King was not only championing for equality, but also coming to terms with her sexuality, as her friendship with Marilyn Barnett (**Andrea Riseborough**) developed. Riggs, one of the first self-made media-age celebrities, wrestled with his gambling demons, at the expense of his wife Priscilla (**Elisabeth Shue**). Together, Billie and Bobby served up a cultural spectacle that resonated far beyond the tennis court, sparking discussions in bedrooms and boardrooms that reverberate today. I DO UNTIL I DON'T



In Vero Beach, Florida, a trio of couples at various points in their relationships become the subjects of a film about marriage being an antiquated idea that needs a reboot: Why not turn marriage into a seven-year deal with an option to renew? For Alice and Noah (**Lake Bell, Ed Helms**), more than a hint of boredom is setting in as they approach their first decade together and the prospect of parenthood. Meanwhile, Alice's funky sister Fanny (**Amber Heard**) is sure her "open marriage" to Zander (**Wyatt Cenac**) is the key to their free-spirited happiness. And then there's Cybil and Harvey (**Mary Steenburgen**, **Paul Reiser**), a pair of empty-nesters wondering what the next stage will be. As the manipulative filmmaker (**Dolly Wells**) attempts to show how marriage is outmoded, the couples she interviews discover the do's and don't's in their own relationships. (**USA, 2017, 103 min., R, English | Dir. Lake Bell**)

"In a World" star/director Lake Bell returns with this lively comedy about a jaded filmmaker who believes that marriage is an outmoded concept that needs a reboot. She sets out to find the meaning of matrimony by interviewing three couples at various stages in their relationships.

THE OATH



Blinded by love and a burgeoning habit of "powdering her nose," Anna's an unemployed dropout. Her father Finnur, realizes after his father passes away, that he needs to step in. Her boyfriend Ottar is a bad influence, surrounding her with shady drug dealers and keeping her out all hours of the night. When Anna calls Finnur in a drug-induced hysteria, he decides he has to get her boyfriend, Ottar to leave her alone for good. But calling the cops to their apartment does nothing but get Ottar's drugs confiscated, and Finnur must repay Ottar or he'll hurt his family. This high-stakes gritty thriller by Icelandic director **Baltasar Kormakur** (*Everest, 2 Guns*) also stars him in the lead as Finnur, and is stylistically taut and glossy, making excellent use of the dramatic Icelandic landscapes. (**Iceland, 2016, 104 min., NR, Icelandic with English subtitles**) **Dir. Baltasar Kormákur**)

When his daughter gets involved with a manipulative drug dealer, a loving father fights to save her and finds himself resorting to extreme measures in a dramatic *Taken*-style psychological thriller from Icelandic director and star Baltasar Kormakur.

PATTI CAKE\$



In a coming-of-age story straight out of gritty strip-mall suburban Jersey, an unlikely rapper finds her voice as a one-of-a-kind hip-hop legend in the making in *PATTI CAKE\$*, the first feature film from acclaimed commercial and music-video director **Geremy Jasper**. Plussized white girl, aspiring rapper Patricia "Dumbo" Dombrowski, AKA Killa P, AKA Patti Cake\$, is cheered on by her grandmother and only friends, Jheri and Basterd, while shouldering her mother's heartaches and misfortunes. PATTI CAKE\$ chronicles an underdog's quest for fame and glory with humor, raw energy and some unforgettable beats. (USA, 2016, 108 min., R, English | Dir. Geremy Jasper)

PATTI CAKE\$ is a big girl with a big mouth and big dreams of rap superstardom. Stuck in Lodi, New Jersey, Patti battles an army of haters as she strives to break the mold and take over the rap scene.

REBEL IN THE RYE

Starring Nicholas Hoult, Kevin Spacey, and Sarah Paulson



This biopic of legendary author J.D. Salinger (Nicholas Hoult) details his relationship with socialite Oona O'Neill (Zoey Deutch), his experiences fighting in World War II, and his writing process for The Catcher in the Rye. Kevin Spacey and Sarah Paulson co-star. Written and directed by Danny Strong, *Rebel in the Rye* made its world premiere at the 2017 Sundance Film Festival. (USA, 2017, 106 min., PG-13, English | Dir. Danny Strong)

The life of author J. D. Salinger from his youth to the World War II era, including his romantic life and the publication of his debut novel *The Catcher in the Rye*.

STRONGER Starring Jake Gyllenhaal



Inspired by a true story and based on the New York Times bestseller by Jeff Bauman and Bret Witter, the film stars **Jake Gyllenhaal** as the working-class Boston man whose iconic photo from the 2013 Boston Marathon bombing gained worldwide notice. Jeff Bauman was waiting for his girlfriend at the finish line of the marathon when two pressure-cooker bombs exploded, killing three people and injuring more than 260 others. After regaining consciousness in the hospital, Jeff is able to help law enforcement identify one of the suspects, but his own battle is just beginning. With unwavering support from his family and girlfriend, Jeff embarks on a long and heroic journey to physical and emotional rehabilitation. (USA, 2017, 110 min., English | Dir. Alexander Janko)

Jake Gyllenhaal stars in the inspiring real life drama of Jeff Bauman whose life was changed forever by the Boston Marathon bombing.

TULIP FEVER

Starring Alicia Vikander and Christoph Waltz



Tulip Fever, written by **Tom Stoppard** (writer of *Shakespeare in Love*) is based on Deborah Moggach's (screenwriter of *Pride & Prejudice*) novel of the same name. It takes place in early 17th century Netherlands, during tulip mania, a historically significant period when contract prices for bulbs reached record-high levels. Artist Jan Van Loos (**Dane DeHaan**) is commissioned by Cornelis Sandvoort (**Christoph Waltz**) to paint his and his young wife's portraits. He falls for the married woman, Sophia (**Alicia Vikander**), and they have a passionate, clandestine affair. The two lovers invest in the risky but booming tulip bulb market in hopes of raising money to run away and build a future together. Also stars **Cara Delevingne**, **Judi Dench**, **Zach Galifianakis**, and several others. (**USA & UK, 2017, 107 min., English, NR, DCP | Dir. Justin Chadwick**)

An artist falls for a young married woman while he's commissioned to paint her portrait during the Tulip mania of 17th century Amsterdam.



The new film from the acclaimed directors Dardenne brothers (*Two Days, One Night*) is a searing saga of guilt and redemption. One evening after work hours, Jenny (**Adèle Haenel**), a young doctor, allows the door buzzer at the small clinic where she works to go unanswered. It's only later that she learns that the person ringing was an unidentified African woman found dead shortly after by the side of a road. Consumed by the thought that she is to blame, Jenny embarks on an obsessive crusade to discover who the anonymous woman was and to see to it that she is not forgotten. Shot through with low-key suspense and the heart-stopping realism that has become the directors' trademark, Unknown Girl is both a gripping mystery and a profoundly human moral tale. (Belgium/France, 2016, 113 min., NR, French with English subtitles | Dir. Jean-Pierre Dardenne & Luc Dardenne)

The legendary Dardenne brothers return with another searing drama about the profound moral challenges of everyday life is this gripping tale of a young doctor who becomes obsessed with exploring the death of a woman who died outside her clinic.

WOODSHOCK

Starring Kirsten Dunst

The exquisite feature film debut of visionary fashion designers Kate and Laura Mulleavey (Rodarte), *Woodshock* is a hypnotic exploration of isolation, paranoia, and grief that exists in a dream-world all its own. **Kirsten Dunst** stars as Theresa, a haunted young woman spiraling in the wake of profound loss, torn between her fractured emotional state and the reality-altering effects of a potent cannabinoid drug. Immersive, spellbinding, and sublime, *Woodshock* transcends genre to become a singularly thrilling cinematic experience that marks the arrival of the Mulleavy siblings as a major new voice in film. **(USA, 2017, 100 min., R, English | Dir. The biggest names in the jazz world started in small clubs, made recordings, and were played on the radio, eventually making their way to the silver screen. During the Depression Era, the movies in the 1930's searched for a gimmick to capitalize on the popular genre of jazz and thus created "promotional" short films of jazz bands and singers of the era, using this format into the 1950's. Some musicians made it into cartoons as well. This program will highlight such stars as Louis Armstrong, Ethel Waters, Fats Waller, Cab Calloway, Jimmy Dorsey, Bing Crosby, and many more, including a special tribute to Sarah Vaughn. SPECIAL SCREENING DAVID GILMOUR LIVE AT POMPEI Wednesday, September 13 at 7:30 pm Members \$11 Public \$16

Forty-five years after **Pink Floyd**'s David Gilmour filmed 'Live At Pompeii' in the legendary Roman Amphitheatre there, he returned for two spectacular shows, part of his year-long tour in support of his No.1 album 'Rattle That Lock'. The performances were the first-ever rock concerts for an audience in the stone Roman amphitheatre, and, for two nights only, the 2,600 strong crowd stood exactly where gladiators would have fought in the first century AD. And now cinema audiences can be there too, as part of a worldwide cinematic event to take place on September 13th. Both concerts also saw very special performances of '*The Great Gig In The Sky*' from '*The Dark Side Of The Moon*', which David rarely plays as a solo artist. This concert performance film includes highlights from both shows, filmed by director **Gavin Elder**. 
